



## **Facilitator Instructions**

1. **Course presentation is a PowerPoint on CD (enclosed).**
2. **Facilitator notes are found in notebook – 14 pages.** Notes are labeled by slide (correspond to PowerPoint slides). Presenter reads notes and/or discusses topics as listed per slide.
3. **Slides 1 – 3 and notes immediately following on page 1 of the presenter notes are the introduction.**
4. **When you conclude slide #3, toggle off the PowerPoint.**
5. **Segment 1: “Quality of Life Principles That Can Enhance Your Life, Legal Career and Professionalism”**

Play the “Empirical Intersections”/Lawrence Krieger DVD (enclosed) – 40 minute presentation. Note: The DVD presentation includes a PowerPoint (dual screens) – and you have a copy of that PowerPoint in the notebook, as well as the handout, “The Inseparability of Professionalism and Personal Satisfaction: Perspectives on Values, Integrity and Happiness” by Professor Krieger.

6. **Segment 2: “Codes, Creeds, Oaths and Common Sense: Practicing With Professionalism and Effectiveness”**

Toggle back or insert the presenter PowerPoint; advance to slide 4. Notes/discussion points are labeled by slide. Emphasize highlighted text.

*[The course is designed to educate audiences about professionalism, but also serves as a promotion for board certification]*

7. **Part 3: “Diversity in the Legal Profession: Dialog to Stimulate Next Steps”**

Begins on slide 25. Course materials seek audience feedback and ideas; please take notes and return with course notebook.

1. The overall merits of professionalism to lawyers and to the profession.
